City of Idaho Falls Code of Ordinances:

4-1-2: (C) Any applicant may appeal a denial of his or her application by filing a notice of appeal with the City Clerk, within ten (10) days after the date the denial is delivered to the applicant. The notice of appeal shall be in such form as may be approved by the City Clerk and shall in summary form set forth the reasons for the appeal. Such notice of appeal shall be accompanied by a filing fee in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50.00). Such filing fee shall be non-refundable. Upon timely delivery of a notice of appeal and payment of the filing fee, the City Clerk shall schedule a hearing before the City Council within thirty (30) days after the delivery of the notice of appeal. The City Clerk shall also deliver a written notice of hearing to the applicant not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of such hearing. A copy of the notice of hearing shall likewise be sent to the Chief of Police. At the hearing, the City Clerk shall keep a transcribeable, verbatim record of the hearing, including any exhibits or documentary evidence and shall retain such transcript for a period of not less than six (6) months following the conclusion of the hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the City Council shall render a decision, which may be verbal or in writing. Such decision shall succinctly state the reasons for the denial or affirmation of the decision of the City Clerk.


City of Idaho Falls Risk Management Review




This risk analysis is provided by ICRMP's Risk Management team and reviews claims history as well as identifies potential risk management tools to assist you mitigating your risks and reducing claims.

Analysis & Evaluation of Losses

- Claims Period: October 1, 2018 February 2, 2023
- ❖ 737 claims of all coverage types to include: General Liability, Police Liability, Property and Mechanical Breakdown, Auto Liability, and Employment Practices Liability.
- Over the past 5 years, ICRMP has spent approximately \$3,883,901 to support City of Idaho Falls' claims.





- ❖ Idaho Falls' number of claims remain consistent each year.


Five Year History by Coverage




❖ Idaho Fall's top claim costs are related to police liability, followed secondly by auto claims. The number of auto claims makes up 29% of total claims but 15% of the total cost. Whereas police liability claims are only 5.7% total number of claims, but account for 72% of the costs.




Auto Claims 5 Year History



The majority of auto claims frequency and severity are from the Police and Sanitation departments.

Over the last five years, 66% of auto claims were the fault of Idaho Falls employees. ICRMP's online Distracted Driving Course has been made available and can aid in reducing claims as well as after accident remedial training.

Loss Mitigation Plan of Action

Police Liability

Continued specialized risk management training provided by our Law Enforcement Risk Manager. Areas of priority:

- 1. Use of Force
- 2. De-escalation techniques
- 3. EVOC training for driving distractions, intersection awareness during code and backing
- 4. Mental Health

2 Auto Liability

Loss mitigation efforts surrounding driving and vehicles should include the following:

- 1. Annual motor vehicle records checks on prospective and current employees
- 2. Updated vehicle use policies, including post accident procedures and discipline
- 3. Distracted Driver Training has been made available to city. Should be mandatory for new hires and post accident

3 General Liability

- 1. Annual review of line jetting maintenance schedules for sewer/wastewater departments
- 2. Works crews call dig line and identifying lines prior to excavation
- 3. Hazard mitigation to avoid slips, falls, adequate signage, safety for patrons, special attention should be given to swimming pools
- 4. Have maintenance and snow removal plans

Property

Loss mitigation efforts surrounding your facilities to include:

- 1. Total facilities management program: Conduct site inspections and walk throughs, identify hazards. This includes roof inspections, water heaters, boiler & mechanical/HVAC
- 2. Implement a preventative maintenance schedule on all equipment
- 3. Essential to have a snow removal plan
- 4. Focus on fire prevention and safety, inspection of wet/dry fire suppression systems
