Dear Mayor Casper,

Since our last letter and agreement, dated April 29, 2013, on the funding of the Magistrate Court operations, four years have gone by, and it has been equally as long since we calculated the direct costs associated with the Magistrate Court operations.

Attached you will find a report compiled by the courts which provides an updated 2016 detailed summary of the costs for the processing of the misdemeanor and infraction caseloads.

The clerical operational costs of providing the courts specifically for the City of Idaho Falls cases and some of the associated functions, has increased from \$415,000 to \$554,000 in FY 15-16. The attached courts analysis was limited only to the costs associated with the staff that processes the City cases. Using the exact same methodology and analysis as 4 years ago, the costs have gone up by \$139,000 over the past 4 years. These increases are mostly cost of living plus \$35,000.00 per year staff time to scan and archive the 10,000 annual misdemeanor and infraction cases from city law enforcement.

In preparing these costs, the Court did not adjust the operating budget from 4 years ago, and left it at a conservative \$46,800.00, although there have been additional one-time and annual operating expenditures for computer network support, video conferencing/jail arraignments support, evidence presentation technology or video conferencing equipment in our courtrooms.

Additionally, with the last Legislative session authorizing new funding for a 4th Magistrate Judge for Bonneville County, as Commissioners we are faced with finding more facility space for an additional courtroom and staff support for the new judge.

Thus Bonneville County is requesting an increase for FY 17-18 in the funding of the Magistrate Court operations to offset a portion of the costs associated with operating the Magistrate Courts defined in I.C. 1-2218.

For the current fiscal year, Bonneville County has chosen to remain with the current rate of contribution which is \$400,000. During the next four years, starting with FY 17-18, we believe the City of Idaho Falls contribution should be increased to \$600,000, taking into account there will be cost of living increases authorized during the next 4 years. Recognizing this is a significant increase all at once, we are requesting increases of \$50,000 for each of the next 4 years.

There are many benefits of having a consolidated court system, and you will see in the attached report that our clerks remain among the top counties in efficiency based on the number of cases processed per clerk.

In order for us to plan for Fiscal Year 2018 budget we would like to have an indication of the direction you are considering by June 15, 2017.




