Project Update and Request for Assistance: Riverwalk Drive

Following last month's meeting, staff met with Jeff Stokes from Woodbury and Greg Weitzel from Parks and Recreation to try and better understand the change orders made to the pathway and rock wall. Mr. Stokes referenced changes to the original plans that increased the cost after the maximum reimbursement costs had been established in the OPA. The change that added the most cost was a requirement by the Engineering Division to change the grade of the pathways, walls, and storm water retention pond from a 4% grade to a 3% grade. This was a substantial change to the drawings and cost of the project. The change in grade essentially doubled the amount of retaining wall required along the pathway. In other words, the change orders were not for a "bigger, better" greenbelt, but rather for required changes to the original drawings.

At last month's meeting, the emphasis was on assistance with the extra rock blasting and removal instead of looking at all the change orders. This is mainly for accounting purposes for Woodbury. As noted in last month's memo, Woodbury was not required to build Riverwalk Drive or the pathway along the greenbelt. They did that at the Agency's request. The hotel site work was their project. All of the costs for Riverwalk Drive, the pathway, and all other public improvements can be covered by the maximum guaranteed price in the OPA. It is Woodbury's strong preference that all of the public costs be finalized and paid and the request for additional funds only be for the rock removal on the private property for their project. The change order for the removing additional 8,073 cubic yards of rock plus import for utility trenches totaled \$350,405 (see the attached change order). Woodbury has been able to find enough savings elsewhere to only need to request \$276,625 of this amount.

Mr. Stokes has continued to adjust his requested number as more of the project is finalized. At this point the request is still for \$276,625.00. However, Mr. Stokes may provide a slightly revised number at the meeting.

OPA with Ball Ventures

In 2016 the OPA with Ball Ventures was amended for an additional \$665,000. The work was completed and approved for payment by the Agency in late 2016. However, a new note has not yet been executed. This is in part because Ball Ventures recently requested consideration of a

cash payment instead of a note. Staff determined that payment in full of the \$665,000 would put future payments towards the original OPA amount at risk of default. Staff is meeting again on Wednesday to determine a recommended maximum cash payment if the board is inclined to pay any cash. If there is no cash payment, or a partial cash payment, Ball Ventures is ready to execute the new note and requests authorization from the Board to proceed with preparing any necessary documents.

Project Update: The Broadway (Kelsch)

Since the last meeting, Harper-Leavitt Engineering provided a report on the garage suggesting that there were some upgrades to accommodate the three-story building above. However, in reviewing the total costs of garage, it was determined that the additional costs were minimal and covered by other features of the garage not originally included in the costs. Engineering also confirmed that the costs of the construction materials were fair and reasonable. Staff and the Vice-Chairman gave authorization to proceed with the execution of the Purchase and Sale Agreement and to convey the property to the Oppenheimer group. There was a \$14,999 reimbursement to the Oppenheimer group from their initial deposit and \$100,000 as per the PSA.

The project continues to move forward with excavation. The excavation has been behind schedule due to the extra contaminated soil found on the site.

Project Update: Bonneville Hotel

The announcement for tax credit awards was moved from October 31 to December 1. Staff will send an email to the board as soon as the announcements are made. The process for historic preservation tax credits remains on schedule.

Project Update: Jackson Hole Junction

On November 9, the City Council approved the urban renewal district for Jackson Hole Junction by a 4-2 vote. They accepted the Agency's recommendation of a 13 year district with a maximum amount of assistance of \$4 million.
